The Fund for the Study of the American Jewish Experience, one of the funds in Adat Shalom's endowment, arrived at Adat Shalom, as such funds often do, with a family history. The money itself came from a family foundation established by my father, Barton E. Ferst and his two brothers. All grew up in West Philadelphia, graduated from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, established professional careers, and held leadership positions in both Philadelphia and national Jewish organizations. After they died, four of us in the next generation were given the privilege of distributing the remaining funds and closing the foundation. My share went to Adat Shalom where I was one of the original members of the committee that established our endowment. The choice of subject—the focus on our experience in our country—reflects my father's lifetime of volunteer work in Jewish American organizations and his deep concern about Jewish education. Although Adat Shalom has had the funds for many years, Project Shema is the inaugural program. I hope there will be many more.
